Split wood \$50 (1.5 m3) small trailer.

Split wood \$80 (2.5m3) larger trailer.

For those who have helped in cutting up the trees and used their own equipment and fuel may take a free small trailer load of fire wood. Up to you to split it. If you want it split then that would be an extra \$20.

Working Bee list for Sunday 25 August

First off thanks heaps for all those who turned up for the last three working bees. The July working bee numbers were down on the previous two, however, a lot was achieved.

Please sign in on main deck for health and safety plus lunch requirements. We take **health and safety** seriously so please ensure proper safety equipment is used. Proper hi -vis jackets required and proper safety equipment for all tasks.

Golf course trees

- · Cut rings for splitting. Chainsaw and safety equipment required.
- Move cut rings close to log splitter. Gloves and ear muffs required.
- Start fire and supervise adding material as required. Gloves required. Neighbours to be informed.
- Move any last trimmings into a pile ready for burning.
- Split wood using a log splitter dependent on weather.

Other jobs

Pick up trimmings in lower dell and take down to golf course for burning.

Clear leaves etc. from BBQ area.

Clear leaves at front gate.

Clear out behind pool fence (eg, wandering willie and old man's beard).

Spray gravel drive way and sealed areas. Weather permitting.

Cut down Sycamores behind cabin 1 and pull out vines.

Mow lawns around cabins.

Weed eat around edges and along bank by volleyball and miniten courts.

Clean all ablution blocks.

Trim tops of trees in FAL left of Brent and Lindsay's cabin.

Trim trees along footpath to the main road.

Any other jobs that you can see.

Gardens (See Jude and Jeff)

Weed along driveway up to Faraway Land.

Weed wandering willie from the bank behind all of the cabins.

Weed gardens below the hall.

Did I mention the fabulous lunches!


