


The winners of the doubles Kubb were Toni and Steve, and the singles was taken out by Steve in a gripping final against Toni!

Changes to Membership and Site Fees

As agreed at the AGM in 2023 we regretfully have to increase membership and site fees to cover rising costs of maintenance and day to day running of our club. You will all be aware of how inflation is hitting all of us with increases in Insurance, Power and all the materials we need to maintain the grounds. We remain grateful for the vast amount of free labour and materials many members generously contribute but we also recognise that increasingly we will need to pay for more services as fewer members are able to contribute time and materials.

As a committee our objective is to continue to try to grow our membership and visitor numbers to generate additional income to help fund the day to day needs of the club to ensure we continue to be the premiere naturist club in New Zealand. This year has seen a dramatic rise in visitors with our custodians generating amazing feedback from visitors. If this continues, we should be able to offset the level of any future increases.

If you pay monthly by standing order, please update these for your April payment as follows:

Single member, Increase from \$26 to \$28 per month.

If a Couple, please increase from \$52 to \$56 per month.


If single member with a site, please increase from \$65 to \$71 per month.

If a Couple with a site, please increase from \$90 to \$99 per month.

If you pay annually, you have the option to move to monthly. If you wish to do this, please contact the treasurer (treasurer@wellingtonnaturists.co.nz) before 1 April otherwise you will be invoiced as follows:

Single member \$320 Couple \$640 Single member with a site \$815 Couple with a site \$1,135
