#### Around the grounds





The golf course is looking very neat after the removal of all the tree trimmings allowing the grass to be mowed sufficient for a round now. Our recent visitors from the US proved it is fit for purpose.

#### Rationale and usage of the new storage container

Feedback from visitors this year continues to be outstanding and focuses on the quality and standard of our facilities and the welcoming atmosphere and general culture they experience. If you have not reviewed the visitor book in the bar it is worth a read.

In order that we continue to develop our facilities and maintain the great feedback and maintain our club in a form that as members we can be proud of many members have volunteered time and equipment to do extensive work this year on our grounds and buildings.

We are consequently running out of tool storage and workspace, so we decided in late March to take advantage of an opportunity that arose to purchase in a 40ft container at a good price which is now down behind the painted fence by the golf course. This container represented excellent value and now provides us with a very secure and dry storage space.

#### Specifically, the container will be used for the following:

- \*Storing paints, paint trays, brushes etc. for club use.
- \*Secure storage of power tools e.g. circular saw benches, Drop saws, drill presses, steel working gear, welders, mowers etc which are used for club and member site maintenance and construction purposes. Movement of these items away from our site and visitor areas will limit the amount of disturbance they can cause. Dave C or Steve S own many of these tools but are happy for anyone to make use of the equipment under supervision and with the owners and club permission.
- \*Temporary storage of broken equipment for repair such as spade handles, wheelbarrows and mowers etc.

#### The future plan for the container is to:

- \*Install windows to allow light in and air circulation.
- \*Install power for machinery and lighting
- \*Build a ramp to allow easy access and a hard stand area
- \*Later we plan to build a lean too between the container and the fence for dry storage of reuseable timber

#### Mowers will still be available at Midlands, FAL and under hall for lowlands and main lawn use.

Rakes, shovels, spades wheelbarrows and weed eaters will continue to be stored under the hall for easy access by members. This will be tidied and allow room for the ride on mower.

The fuel for mowers will still be kept in the fuel locker by Miniten courts noting that the green container is only to be used for 2 stroke engines such as weed eaters.

## This is the Eulogy presented by Mike M at the funeral on Monday 14th April

Marie along with Rob and family joined the Wellington Naturist Club in January 1968.

Right from the time they joined they found it was a wonderful environment and being the person she is Marie got involved in lots of club activities. Sport, especially volleyball, was popular along with water sports, they were also very good indoor bowlers.

She also found the club environment good for their young children who were safe and made lots of friends



Marie enjoyed visiting other naturist clubs around New Zealand and meeting like minded people. Some of those people are still friends today. They formed a group who travelled overseas and visited many naturist places around the world. They have a number of photo albums from those trips and a lot of good memories

Marie is a very talented artist she painted, did macramé, mosaics and almost any of the arty things that were popular at the time. Sitting in their home last Thursday the walls are covered in Maries handy work, plus she has given a lot away, I know of two items that she made that are taking pride of place in our house.

During the annual festivals Marie ran some craft sessions which were always popular. The grounds at Te Marua, Upper Hutt, are decorated with a number of murals and birds and clowns all painted by Marie.

As club members Marie and Rob enjoyed going off and doing little jobs on their own in particular concrete steps where Marie mixed the concrete and took it to Rob to lay. They also placed the handrails on the steps.

Very keen for the club to progress Marie fully supported club activities and members trying to make the club a better place

She had her views but never took sides although she would reinforce her opinions. There was a time when members of the committee were looking to sell the old tractor in the playground for scrap, Marie voiced her opinion and the tractor issue was put on the back burner but to enforce her point we next saw the tractor being given a new paint job.

Marie was pretty social she made a point of supporting club functions even when she was not all that well.

We used Marie as a sounding post and her advice was very practical and to the point. She was a very good person to have available for any club disputes she gave an honest and thoughtful opinion.

Marie was a very caring person and many of can tell stories of her letting us know if we were burning or she had seen an abnormality.

She was a well respected and popular member in the club and we all enjoyed her friendly banter over the board games she and Rob played and a cuppa or at the BBQs or other functions.

Rob has asked me not to mention him in this eulogy but how could we not do so as they were a very close couple and normally seen together.

Two years ago the Club honoured them both with life membership a very well deserved award.

Marie you were known for doing things your own way and in your last days you kept us on edge and doing things in your own time.


